WARNING:

The air suspension system is under pressure (up to 10 bar, or 150 lbf/in). Verify pressure has been relieved and disconnect power to the air suspension system prior to disassembly. Do not allow dirt or grease to enter the system. Always wear standard hand, ear, and eye protection when servicing the air suspension system.

- Not to be stored below 5°F (-15°C) and above 122°F (50°C).
- Avoid damage to air lines and cables.
- Removal and installation is only to be performed by fully qualified personnel.
- Use car manufacturer's diagnostic software.

CAUTION:

Damage to the vehicle and air suspension system can be incurred if work is carried out in a manner other than specified in the instructions or in a different sequence.

To avoid the possibility of short circuits while working with electric components consult your owner's manual on how to disconnect your battery.

Consult your vehicle owner's manual, service manual, or car dealer for the correct jacking points on your vehicle and for additional care, safety and maintenance instructions. Under no circumstances should any work be completed underneath the vehicle if it is not adequately supported, as serious injuries and death can occur.

For vehicles with a "Closed Air Supply System," replacement of components requires proper adherence to procedures set forth within OE servicing literature. Failure to comply with the OE prescribed procedures can result in component damage and/or failure.

FRONT STRUT REMOVAL

1. Raise vehicle and remove the front wheel(s). (Figure 1)






FIGURE 9 FIGURE 10





FRONT COIL-OVER STRUT INSTALLATION



WARNING:

Tighten all nuts and bolts to manufacturer's specifications during the installation process.

1. Insert the new strut into the clevis mount on the hub/knuckle assembly. Ensure that the strut is seated completely and in the correct orientation, with the Arnott stickers facing the wheel studs. (Figures 31, 32)






FIGURE 35 FIGURE 36






FIGURE 39 FIGURE 40







FIGURE 42 FIGURE 43






FIGURE 50 FIGURE 51






FIGURE 53 FIGURE 54

REAR AIR SPRING AND SHOCK REMOVAL







FIGURE 67 FIGURE 68






FIGURE 71 FIGURE 72






FIGURE 77 FIGURE 78






FIGURE 84 FIGURE 85

ELECTRONIC BYPASS MODULE INSTALLATION

1. Remove trim and paneling from inside the trunk on the driver's side to locate the air suspension control module. (Figures 101, 102)

2. Disconnect the harness from the suspension control module. <u>The module will remain unplugged.</u> (Figures 103, 104)

3. For this application, two (2) EBM modules must be used. This is because the removal of the suspension module severs other modules in the daisy chain, which will raise a handful of DTC errors if the two modules are not used together. Using the tables, schematic, and photos below, match the wires and splice them together with the T-Tap connectors. **NOTE: The EBM with the blue dot is for "Lo-Speed" or "GMLAN 2" referenced in the schematic.** (Figures 105, 106, 107, 108, 109)




